MISCELLANEOUS

In order to allow sufficient time for coaching there will be 20 places available in each class allocated on a first come, first served basis. Please contact the secretary to be placed on the waitlist in the event of the class being full, preferably by email. The status of the classes will be shown on the BE website.

All competitors will be scored together and the top 25% from each of the 3 classes will qualify for the Series Final in their respective class. Riders on the top 100 list and anyone on 2011/2012 performance programmes will incur a 5 point penalty (please declare this to the secretary on the day, before competing).

For non-Members to take part in Jump Training both horse and rider must both have Lifetime Registration Numbers which you can get free on www.britisheventing.com. Full members can compete horses that do not have a current season ticket under the discounted Member rate but again horses must have a free Lifetime Registration Number.

About the competition

British Eventing Baileys Jump Training is open to all riders, whether affiliated to British Eventing or not, and offers a unique opportunity to obtain training, advice and support within a competitive environment.

Aimed at those starting out in Eventing as well as those already competing at BE80, BE90 and BE100 level; it is judged on STYLE and PERFORMANCE. The aim of the competition is to encourage competitors to improve their technique and, in so doing, improve their results.

The courses are built to the standard of a British Eventing Show Jumping track and are designed to encourage effective riding. In 2012, a national series of 10 qualifiers is scheduled and the top 25% of each class will be eligible to enter for the final of the series to be held at Solihull Riding Club on 6 April. All qualifiers will be given full details, regarding the final, upon qualification.

THE COMPETITION FORMAT

The competition is split into three phases. Each rider will be given a start time for each phase.

Phase 1: The course walk: The BE Accredited Coaches will conduct a course walk at the beginning of each Class. This is part of the training exercise and should not be missed. The walk is conducted in two groups for maximum benefit to the competitors.

Phase 2: Guided working in: Each rider will receive a guided warm up with an Accredited Coach prior to phase 3. Riders will be warmed up as required, for approximately six minutes. There will be sufficient time to warm up prior to your coaching.

Phase 3: The competition : Riders will jump one round, watched by an Accredited Coach, and receive feedback and advice. They will then remain in the arena and jump a second round. Both rounds will be scored and jumping faults deducted. The scores from both rounds will be added together to provide a final score. Comment sheets are available for collection at the end of the competition.

Scoring and Faults: The course will consist of up to 12 fences and the BE90 and BE100 will include a double. Positive scores are given as follows for each round.

A: The horse's balance and rhythm. *Max 10 marks*

B: The horse's paces and quality of the jump. *Max 10 marks*

C: The rider's ability to present the horse correctly to the fence and ride accurate lines. *Max 10 marks*

D: The rider's position, balance and ability to follow the horse's movement over the fence. *Max 20 marks*

THE SERIES FINAL:

The Series Final will be held at Solihull Riding Club on 6 April. Combinations who have qualified for the final will be notified, in writing, and provided with entry details. At the Final, Coaching will again be given during warm-up after which it is intended that competitors will be judged riding on the flat and then over a course of show jumps. Coaching, feedback and advice will be given in a similar manner as at the qualifiers.

Refunds: Refunds may be given after the close of entries on production of a medical/veterinary form.

Stabling: Please contact the venue directly.

Directions: Please look on the venue's website for directions or contact them directly.

Dress: BE Rules 2012 for Show Jumping. i.e. Tweed coat with coloured stock or collar and tie and plain black/brown boots, alternatively navy/black coat with white stock and plain black boots; buff (fawn) breeches; gloves; hard hat which should comply with BE standard for Show Jumping with black or dark blue cover. (Any untagged hard hat will require inspection at declaration). Leather gaiters and matching leather boots are acceptable. Riders under the age of 16 may wear jodhpurs with jodhpur boots and/or plain black or brown half chaps.

Miscellaneous:

- Competitors making postal entries will be contacted if they have been placed on the waiting list.
- This training is given under the auspices of British Eventing and will be overseen by British Eventing Accredited Coaches and Officials, whose decisions will, in all matters, be final.
- The competition timetable may be subject to variation according to entries received, conditions and the facilities available.
- The competition is open to any rider who will be 12 and over in 2012; there is no upper age limit.

- Horses/ponies must be at least 142cms and be aged 4 years or over in 2012.
- There is no limit to the number of horses/ponies a rider may enter (providing there is sufficient space in the class) except at the final where only two horses may compete with the same rider.
- Only qualifying combinations will be eligible for the final. In exceptional circumstances the British Eventing Jump Training Team reserve the right to alter or amend the number of qualifiers or participants at the final, as they see fit.

In the event of equal placing, the competitor with the better jumping result will be awarded the higher placing. i.e. where two competitors have an equal final score of 35 and one has a clear round and the other 4 jumping faults, the competitor with the clear round will achieve the higher placing.

- Any objections must be made, within 15 minutes of the incident, together with a deposit of £10. The decision of the BE Official is final.
- Please ensure you declare your intention to ride and collect your number, paying the start fee of £2, before the course walk.
- Participants will be expected to uphold the standards of safety, welfare and discipline normally expected at a BE competition. BE Rules and details of how to join British Eventing can be found at www.britisheventing.com.
- As this is a training competition it is open to horses of all grades.
